
Inspiring our future workforce

Leadership


The Instep Young Leaders'

Instep partners with **local authorities**, the **University of Waikato** and **Toi Ohomai Institute of Technology** to run a range of leadership focused interactive workshops.

An overnight noho is held at a local marae at the beginning of each year to build collaborative relationships and a connection to the region.

Student leaders are given the opportunity to work with their peers from other schools on year-long collaborative projects that tackle issues that matter to youth.

An end-of-year breakfast is held to farewell those students leaving school, reflect on the achievements of the current year, implement changes for the following year, and be inspired by a motivational guest speaker to meet future leadership challenges with confidence.

Each year, senior students across all Instep schools are selected to receive an **Acorn Foundation / Dale Carnegie scholarship** to complete an intensive three-day Dale Carnegie 'Skills for Success' workshop. This unique opportunity is made possible through the generosity of Acorn Foundation donor, Mary McGowan.

Instep works with partners such as **Toi Kai Rawa Māori Economic Development Trust** to ensure rangatahi Māori have access to future work and training pathways that realise their values, skills and passions.

- yia! Innovation Expo to showcase previous entrants' ideas and inspire new students to enter (February/March)

- yia! x YES Senior Student Bootcamp Breakfast, featuring workshops facilitated by local innovation legends (June)
- yia! Pre-judging, featuring volunteer judges from across our local business community (July)
- yia! People's Choice Voting, where the public get their chance to view top entries and vote for their favourites (August)
- yia! Finalists' Workshops, facilitated by a superstar innovator, students take their ideas to the next level (August)
- yia! Awards Night, a celebration of innovation featuring inspirational speakers and the competition winners (August)
- yia! Teacher Professional Development Workshop, inspiring our educators to equip our students with the power of problem-based learning (November)
- yia! Internship experiences, local businesses host students to develop their ideas in real-world settings (November - February)
